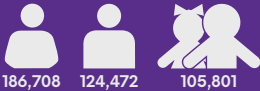
THEMATIC AREAS & SERVICE OUTREACH



WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE

In Pakistan, top 10% lack clean water, while 36% lack basic sanitation. Stunted growth affects 38% of children, while 44% of women and girls experience period poverty. Endemic diarrheal disease claims 2.5 million lives.

PROGRAM RECIPIENTS (416,981)



Providing adequate water and sanitation schemes with appropriate technological solutions. Promoting awareness on health & hygiene.



FOOD SECURITY, NUTRITION, AND LIVELIHOOD

Pakistan has low HDI in Asia, ranks 92/116 in global hunger index. 43% of households face food insecurity, 8 million are unemployed. 23% of the population is food insecure, and 38% of children suffer from chronic malnutrition.

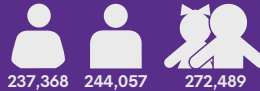
FRDP promotes climate-smart agriculture and self-employment, while also providing food and nutrition supplements



EMERGENCY, DISASTER & RISK REDUCTION

Pakistan ranks eighth in climate vulnerability. With 150+ major disasters in the last two decades, over 120 million people were affected and economic losses surpassed \$19 billion. The 2022 flood caused \$14.9 billion in damages and \$15.2 billion in economic losses.

PROGRAM RECIPIENTS (756,914)



FRDP promotes renewable energy, climate resilient infrastructure, urban planning, and assists authorities in relief, recovery, and rehabilitation for disaster-affected communities.



EDUCATION & AWARENESS

Pakistan has the world's second highest number of out-of-school children, around 22.8 million, with a majority being girls. Dropout rates have risen to 10% to 25% in urban areas. Challenges like insufficient public spending (2.9% of GDP), limited school access, poor infrastructure, gender disparities, cultural barriers, teacher shortages, and low educational standards hinder education and awareness efforts.

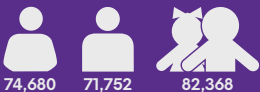
FRDP enforces education legislation, guarantees free and compulsory education rights, and creates models for marginalized children. It also supports the provision of WASH facilities in rural public institutions.



YOUTH & WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

With 64% of its population under 30 years old and women comprising 49% of the population, Pakistan faces significant gender inequality, ranking 151 out of 153 countries on the gender inequality index. Each year, nearly four million youth enter the workforce, while only one million jobs are added annually.

PROGRAM RECIPIENTS (228,800)



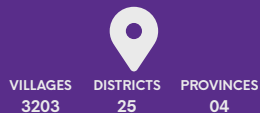
FRDP supports youth-led initiatives and their involvement in decision making. Skill development, entrepreneurship, and employment opportunities for young people and women are key focuses. FRDP promotes self-employability, mental health, gender equality, and social inclusion



SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Top-down approach ignores recipient voices. Limited institutions exist for the people, hindering active participation and awareness of constitutional rights. Political polarization hampers public involvement in local development.

PROGRAM OUTREACH



FRDP promotes inclusive decision making by involving recipients and establishing mechanisms for meaningful consultation and engagement with local communities and stakeholders.



CLIMATE CHANGE

Pakistan's 2022 floods, worsened by climate change, damaged 50% of crops and caused food shortages. Forests cover just 2.2% of the country, while 80% is arid or semi-arid. Desertification and degradation impact around 68 million hectares of fragile land. Water scarcity, droughts, heatwaves, locusts, and landslides are recurring challenges.

FRDP collaborates with national and international forums to strengthen institutions and establish early warning systems for various disasters. This enables timely evacuation and preparedness for events like floods, fires, droughts, locusts, and more. Additionally, FRDP promotes climate resilience practices through community institutions.



GOOD GOVERNANCE

Pakistan ranks 136th on the Legatum Prosperity Index and 118th on the good governance Index. The country's weak law and order situation, fragile governance, and high corruption contribute to its 120th position out of 180 countries. Lack of leadership, reluctance to empower local decision making, and insufficient resources remain significant challenges.

Promoting joint ventures for institutional development and inclusive economic growth. Encouraging local leadership for social and economic well-being. Engaging with local and international forums to ensure transparency and accountability.

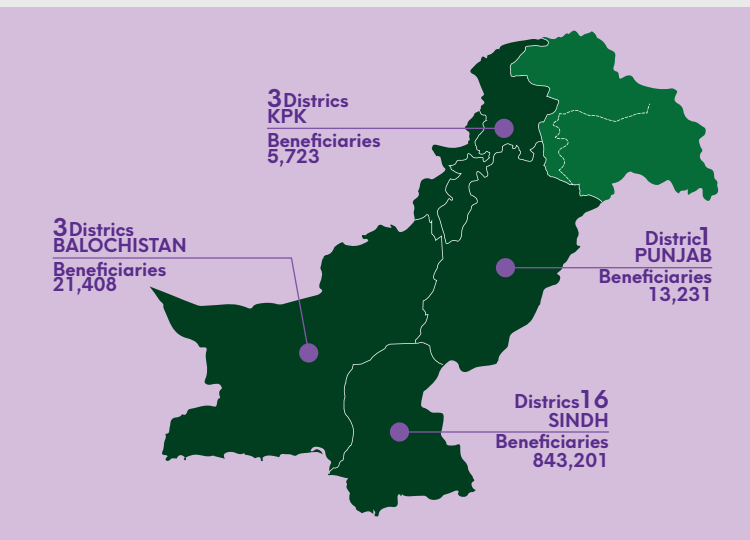
