

# FRDP-KPK Situation Report 02

Flash Floods (Losses and Damages) SitRep-II | August 17, 2025




### **OVERVIEW:**

The disaster, in the form of a cloud burst, centered around August 14–15, triggered by extreme monsoon rains and sudden cloudbursts, devastated regions across KP, particularly Buner, Shangla, Mansehra, Bajaur, Swat, Battagram, and Lower Dir. The toll includes lives lost, massive structural damage, reliance on aerial rescues despite hazards, and ongoing challenges with missing persons and relief delivery.

#### **HUMAN CASUALTIES**

- According to Reuters, more than 307 people were confirmed killed in KP after two days of intense rainfall, cloudbursts, lightning strikes, and landslides, with many still missing Reuters.
- The Associated Press reported at least 220 deaths in Buner district alone, one of the hardest-hit areas, where flash floods and landslides swept away dozens of homes AP News.
- The Wikipedia article on the 2025 Khyber Pakhtunkhwa flash floods notes over 320 fatalities across the province, calling it one of the worst such disasters in recent years.
- The PDMA (Provincial Disaster Management Authority) numbers show 307 deaths and 23 injured across KP in the last 48 hours Aaj, English TV, ARY NEWS.

# DAMAGE TO INFRASTRUCTURE & PROPERTY

- The broader 2025 Pakistan floods Wikipedia entry reports damage to 1,676 buildings across affected areas, with 562 buildings completely destroyed in districts including Swat, Abbottabad, Charsadda, Malakand, Shangla, Lower Dir, and Torghar Wikipedia.
- Specifically in KP, PDMA data notes that 74 homes were affected 63 partially damaged, and 11 fully demolished <u>ARY</u> <u>NEWS, Aai, English TV.</u>
- In Buner district alone: 68 homes, 3 schools, and 16 other structures were destroyed. Additionally, 49 homes in Swat were completely lost <u>Pakistan</u> <u>Today</u>.







# HELICOPTER CRASH & RESCUE DISRUPTIONS:

 A Pakistan Army helicopter engaged in rescue efforts crashed under adverse weather conditions, resulting in the death of all five crew members Reuters Wikipedia Pakistan Today.

# **IMMEDIATE SUPPORT REQUIRED**

The KP government released Rs1 billion in funds to the PDMA for "timely compensation/preparedness and response to cope with any untoward situation. Yet there are areas where people are still waiting for aid and support. FRDP has launched its humanitarian assistance teams are assigned for both Sawat and Buner districts. For one one-month initial assistance phase, we are aiming at:-

### 1. COOKED FOOD:

 Cooked Food for 5000 people (first 1-6 days), followed by one Month of Ration Packs (where markets are washed away) to secure food and accelerate recovery, and preserve dignity.



# 2. EMERGENCY SHELTER KITS (TENTS/TARPS/ROPES)

 Emergency shelter kits (tents/tarps/ropes) for 2000 households, 4000 blankets, sleeping mats; 2000 dignity kits for women/girls; 500 winterization planning for high-altitude pockets.



#### 3. SAFE WATER:

Safe water: Aqua tabs, and jerrycans for some 1500 households.



### 4. SANITATION & HYGIENE:

 Sanitation & hygiene: some 20 Emergency/Makeshift latrines, 1000 soap/MHP kits, 1000 menstrual hygiene materials to prevent outbreaks.



## 5. HEALTH:

 15 Mobile clinics, trauma care supplies, ORS, antibiotics, NFI first-aid kits, and post-flood vector control are required. Additionally, mental health & psychosocial support (MHPSS) for bereaved families and responders is necessary.
