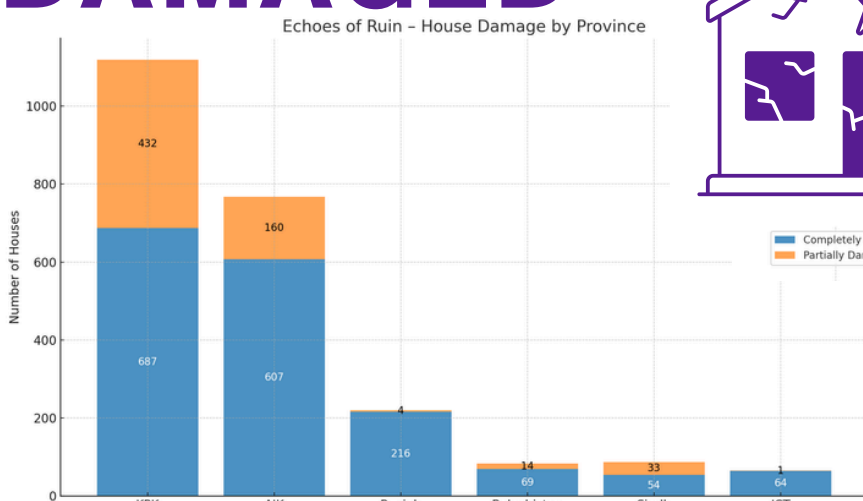

FRDPS RESPONSE TO MONSOON 2025

1. FRDP activated its Provincial Emergency Response Teams for KPK, Punjab, and Sindh.
2. The Field-Based Facilitators in the hotspot areas were assigned to monitor the emerging situation,
3. In response to the Monsoon 2025 devastation in KPK, the FRDP Emergency Team is currently in Buner, assessing losses and addressing the urgent needs of the vulnerable communities. The most affected villages include Pacha, Peer Baba Bazar, Bishonai, and the surrounding areas.
4. Earlier on August 22, 2025, FRDP's Team Lead for KPK, Ms. Sanya Saleem, participated in the UN General Coordination Meeting held at the ADC Relief Office. During the meeting, Ms. Sanya provided an update on the current priorities, outlined the immediate relief as well as recovery plan for the affected populations in the Buner and Swat districts of KPK, Pakistan. The Deputy Commissioner of Buner assured FRDP of full support in carrying out emergency response and recovery efforts, emphasizing strong coordination among government departments and humanitarian partners. The emergency team for KPK, led by Idris Shaikh, also visited affected villages and provided hot meal to communities.

IMMEDIATE SUPPORT REQUIRED

FRDP has launched its humanitarian assistance, teams are assigned for both Sawat and Buner districts. For a one-month initial assistance phase, FRDP is aiming at:-

1. COOKED FOOD:

- Cooked Food for 5000 people (first 1-6 days), followed by one Month of Ration Packs (where markets are washed away) to secure food and accelerate recovery, and preserve dignity.

2. EMERGENCY SHELTER KITS (TENTS/TARPS/ROPES)

- Emergency shelter kits (tents/tarps/ropes) for 2000 households, 4000 blankets, sleeping mats; 2000 dignity kits for women/girls; 500 winterization planning for high-altitude pockets.

3. SAFE WATER:

- Safe water: Aqua tabs, and jerrycans for some 1500 households.

4. SANITATION & HYGIENE:

- Sanitation & hygiene: some 20 Emergency/Makeshift latrines, 1000 soap/MHP kits, 1000 menstrual hygiene materials to prevent outbreaks.

5. HEALTH:

- 15 Mobile clinics, trauma care supplies, ORS, antibiotics, NFI first-aid kits, and post-flood vector control are required. Additionally, mental health & psychosocial support (MHPSS) for bereaved families and responders is necessary.
